Letter from the Collector of Kanara, No.0/A, dated the 8th March 1946.

Under Rule 341(b) of the Financial Publication, No.1, the Collector for special reasons can direct the cash chests of other departments to be lodged in the Treasury strong room for a safe custody. Cash chests as shown below are being deposited in Kanara Huzur ~~Treasury~~ Treasury under the directions of the Collector:-

- 1) 1 Box of the District and Sessions Judge, Kanara.
- 2) 1 Box of the Civil Judge, Karwar.
- 3) 1 Trunk of the Civil Judge, Karwar.
- 4) 1 box of the Head master Local Board School, Karwar.
- 5) 1 cash chest of the District Local Board Overseer, Karwar.
- 6) 1 box of the President, District Local Board, Kanara.
- 7) 1 box of the District Superintendent of Police, Kanara.
- 8) 1 box of the Sub Divisional Magistrate, First Class, Karwar // town.
- 9) 1 box of the Prant Officer, ~~MM~~ Kanara Division,
- 10) 1 box of the Prant Officer, Southern Division.
- 11) 1 box of the Collector of Kanara.
- 12) 1 box of the Huzur Mamlatdar, Karwar (Account Branch).
- 13) 1 box of the Huzur Mamlatdar, Karwar Record Room.
- 14) 1 box of the Mamlatdar, Karwar.

Under Government Resolution, Home Department, No.4336/1931, dated 15th July/~~1932~~, provision has been made for depositing such of the property sent by a court to a treasury or sub-treasury as is received after the closing hour of the treasury, with the senior officer of the Police guard who should receive it, if it is properly secured in a sealed receptacle, and should be responsible for its safe custody. This provision applied only to cash boxes, received from the courts of the District and Subordinate Judges. But there is no provision for keeping other cash boxes which are received after the closing hour of the Treasury with the police guard, with the result that when on occasions for unavoidable reasons,

some offices cannot send their boxes in time, they find it difficult to provide for the safety of the cash boxes.

Mamlatdar, Karwar, reports to me that during the busy purchase season and heavy transactions it is not always possible to send the cash chest to the Huzur treasury in time. Similar is the position with other offices as well though not to such an extent. I would, therefore, recommend that Government may be moved to make similar provisions for depositing other cash chests, in such ^{an} emergency, with the senior officer of the Police guard as in the case of cash chests of the courts."

2. The other Collectors in the Southern Division also support the proposal made by the Collector of Kanara."

Resolution:- Government is pleased to direct that officers depositing cash boxes in a Treasury or a Sub-Treasury for safe custody should finish their cash transactions and send their cash boxes to the Treasury ~~before~~ before the closing hours of the Treasury or Sub-Treasury. If in exceptional circumstances, any cash box is sent to a Treasury or a Sub-Treasury after closing hours, it should be delivered to the Senior officer of the Police guard, who should receive it, if it is properly secured in a sealed receptacle and should be responsible for its safe custody.

2. In places where cash transactions are conducted through banks no armed police guards are usually engaged at treasuries or sub-treasuries for guarding treasury strong rooms. Treasury strong rooms at such places are guarded by unarmed revenue peons or

or watchmen. In such cases the Treasury or Sub-treasury officers are authorised to requisition the services of armed police if in their opinion such a watch is necessary in accordance with Government Resolution, Home Department, No.4336/2, dated 13th February 1931.
