RESOLUTION.

Government is pleased to direct that Forms I and II prescribed under the rule 4 of the Maharashtra Agricultural Lands (Ceiling on Holdings) Rules, 1962, (a draft of which has been published under Government Notification No. 1161/122431-M(Spl), dated 18th January 1962 published in the Maharashtra Government Gazette, Extraordinary, Part IV-B dated 18th January 1962.) should be printed and supplied to the Collectors for being sold to the members of the public at a price to be fixed by the Manager, Government Central Press. In view of the time limit prescribed in Section 12 of the Maharashtra Agricultural Lands (Ceiling on Holdings) Act, 1961, it is essential to print these forms and make them available for sale to the members of the public as early as possible after the rules under the Act are finally published. Government, is, therefore, pleased to direct that the Manager, Government Central Press should give top priority to this work and see that the printed forms reach the Collectors by 20th February 1962.

2. The Collectors should keep these forms for sale in their own offices as well as in the offices of the Mamlatdars; Mahalkaris and Tahsildars.
3. Detailed instructions regarding the size of the forms, their distribution, etc. will be issued separately.
4. The cost of printing may be debited to the head "7-Land Revenue" for the purposes of pro-forma Accounts."
5. The sale proceeds of the form should be credited to the head "XLV-Miscellaneous"- Miscellaneous ".

6. These orders are issued with the concurrence of Finance Department.
