Read:- Government Resolution, Revenue Department No.SRO. 1157-R, dated 28th March 1957.

Government Resolution, Revenue Department No.TRG(RD) 1057/143105-G, dated 17th February 1958.

RESOLUTION:- The following recommendations had been made by Shri M.G.Pimputkar in paragraph 32, 40, 277 and 373 of his Report on the Reorganisation of District Revenue Offices:-

Paragraph 32:- Mamlatdars should tour 180 days in a year (18 days with 10 night halts per month from October to June and 18 days in all during monsoon). They should in fair season, at least spend two spells of three continuous days and nights out of headquarters.

Paragraph 40:- Sub-Divisional Officers need not attend on Very Important Persons and the calls on them for meetings etc., should be regulated.

Paragraph 277:- Tours should not be directed towards mass-contact and individuals should not be forgotten. They should be more fact finding than opinion finding.

Paragraph 373:- Diaries should be maintained day-to-day.

2. Government has carefully considered these recommendations and is pleased to direct that -

(1) In partial modification of the orders issued in Government Resolution, Revenue Department, No.SRO.1157-R, dated 28th March 1957 and in supersession of the orders issued in Government Resolution, Revenue Department, No. TRG(RD) 1057/143105-G, dated 17th February 1958, a standard of 180 days in a year (18 days with ten night halts per month from October to May and 36 days in all during monsoon) should be fixed for Mamlatdars/Mahalkaris. During fair season they should spend at least two spells in a month each of three nights out of headquarters.

(2) In partial modification of the orders issued in Government Resolution, Revenue Department No.SRO.1157-R, dated 28th March 1957, a standard of 190 days in a year (21 days per month from October to May and 22 days in all during monsoon) should be fixed in the case of Prant Officers.

The Prant Officers should also put in 125 night halts during fair season and 10 night halts during monsoon.

(3) In view of the reduced standard of touring and night halts as laid down in (1) and (2) above, the Mamlatdars, Mahalkaris and Prant Officers should draw ordinary travelling allowance in accordance with the rules but in no case the Travelling Allowance should exceed their present Permanent Travelling Allowance.

(4) The object of touring of a Revenue Officer in the villages should be to find out the problems of individuals and though fact finding is a boring process it should not be substituted by opinion finding with mass-contact. The Officers should therefore while on tour spend as many hours as possible for studying the problems of the individuals and find out the facts for themselves.

(5) The touring officers should maintain a detailed diary day-to-day.

3. The orders in para 2(1),(2),(3) above should be given effect from 1st April 1962 and the Commissioners should forward to Government by 20th April 1963 information in the following form in respect of a representative Mamlatdar, Mahalkari and Prant Officer from each district in their respective division and also forward to Government their specific proposals regarding grant of Permanent Travelling Allowance or Travelling Allowance to the Mamlatdars, Mahalkaris, Prant Officers. The information should be for the period from April 1962 to March 1963 and it should be furnished separately for Mamlatdar, Mahalkari and Prant Officer.
